| 1840s | - Arrival of thousands of Irish settlers | - Irish potato crop fails; facing starvation, many lrish move to Canada and other countries |
| 1905-1914 | - Massive immigration to Canadian west from eastern Europe | - Canadian government, wanting to settle the Prairies, offers free land and other incentives to immigrants |
| 1915-1919 | - Little immigration | - World War I and worldwide influenza epidemic limit immigration |
| 1930-1945 | - Little immigration | - World-wide economic depression and World War II limit immigration |
| 1956 | - Many Hungarians come to Canada | - Hungarians revolt against the Russians fails; refugees come to Canada to avoid punishment |
| 1980s-1997 | - Arrival of thousands of Hong Kong Chinese | - Immigrants are looking for political stability before China takes control of Hong Kong in 1997 |
